MARK DELOWERY, DO, MPH

Captain (CAPT) Mark Delowery is the Medical Director for Federal Occupational Health Service (FOH) and also serves as the Division Director of Clinical Services, Office of the Assistant Secretary for Administration, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), and has held this position since his appointment on October 1, 1998.

As Director, CAPT Delowery provides leadership to the largest division in FOH and oversees an organization that delivers Clinical, Wellness/Fitness, Health Promotion, Smoking Cessation, Law Enforcement, Medical Surveillance, Medical Employability and Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Program Services to over half a million Federal employees. These comprehensive occupational health and health promotion services are provided by approximately 800 full and part-time federal and contracted staff through 304 health centers, 42 fitness centers, and a national network of over 3,000 affiliated health providers across the country. He works in partnership with

Federal agencies to design and deliver comprehensive occupational health and health promotion services that improve the health, safety and productivity of their workforce.

CAPT Delowery began his career with FOH in 1986 as a part-time physician, providing physical examinations at occupational health centers in the Philadelphia area. He later became a consultant and chaired the FOH Region III Clinical Quality Assurance Committee. Other assignments included serving as FOH Region III Deputy Division Director and Deputy Director for Marketing and Customer Service.

Prior to receiving his commission with the United States Public Health Service (PHS) in 1993, Dr. Delowery was in solo private practice for seven years in Wayne, Pennsylvania. During this time, he also served as a supervisor and clinical instructor to Family Medicine Residents in rotations at underprivileged clinics in Philadelphia.

Dr. Delowery graduated from LaSalle University in Philadelphia with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Biology. He earned his medical degree from the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine where he completed his internship and was chosen Chief Resident of the Family Medicine Residency Program. Dr. Delowery later earned a Master's Degree in Public Health (MPH) from the Medical College of Wisconsin. He is board certified in Family Medicine.

CAPT Delowery is a highly decorated career officer who has received numerous PHS and HHS awards throughout his tenure, nearly one for every year of service. Additionally, he is a member of many professional organizations including the American Medical Association, American Osteopathic Association and the American College of Occupational and Environmental Medicine.
